## **Be You Family Survey**

Recently, our Be You Action Team, school staff, School Board and P&C members signed the "Be You Statement of Commitment". Class teachers are having discussions with their classes about the importance of a mentally healthy learning community and classes will also sign the Statement of Commitment, which was published in our previous school newsletter.

Fremantle Primary School is now moving from Stage 1 (Lay the foundations for success) to Stage 2 (Identify your learning community's needs) in the implementation process. We have begun the process of gathering information from across the school community. Part of this process includes student, educator and family surveys. Please find below important information and a link to this survey for parents and community members. It is important to note;

- **The surveys are being used to find out what's already working and map out further actions to take to support a mentally healthy learning community**
- **Completing the survey is entirely your choice and you can choose not to answer some or all of the questions**
- **It will take approximately 10-15 minutes to complete**
- **Responses are anonymous and only averaged results will be used – no names are recorded**
- **Survey questions ask for your perspectives, so there are no right or wrong answers**

**Unfortunately, surveys must be completed on a computer. It will not work on phone or tablet**


