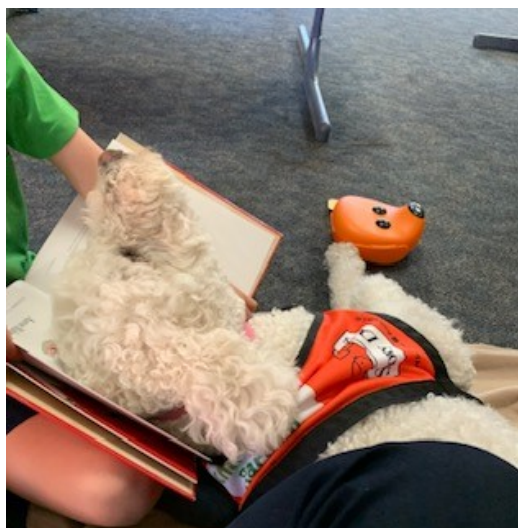
## **Interschool Athletics**

**Charges** are payments for all extra cost optional components. Examples of these activities are Edu-dance, in-term swimming lessons, class excursion, Bookweek activities. These activities are included in the Bulk Activity Payment and the amounts are deducted from your child's account as each activity takes place. If the full Bulk has not been expended for the calendar year, a credit will carry over in to the next year. At the completion of Year 6 any credit remaining on your child's account will be refunded; or at your request transferred to the account of a younger sibling still at the school.

Charges such as Year 6 Camp and Year 5 Big Day Out at Woodman Point are additional charges and are required to be paid separately to the Bulk.

As of today's date we have several payments outstanding for charges incurred by students participating in activities that have not been paid for. Below is a sample of outstanding costs against our big ticket items:
